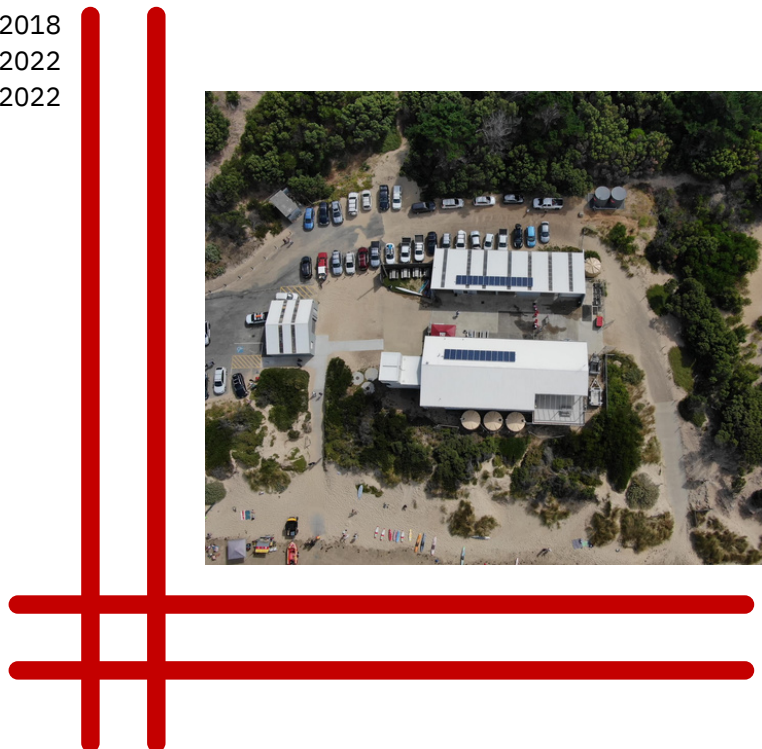

The President's Report- Christine Gaby



I am humbled and honoured to once again have the privilege to write the President's Report for the 22-23 season. With our clubhouse mostly complete it has been so pleasing to see our energies following our strategic plan initiatives.

The executive feels so strongly about our improvements from the season it was decided to nominate our club for the SLST Club of the Year, to be announced at the Annual Award and presentation night in August. At the time of writing this we do not know the outcome but I do know we have a very strong nomination and are certainly worthy contenders.

A summary of the achievements for the season are highlighted below.

Our people

Record 24% increase in club membership.

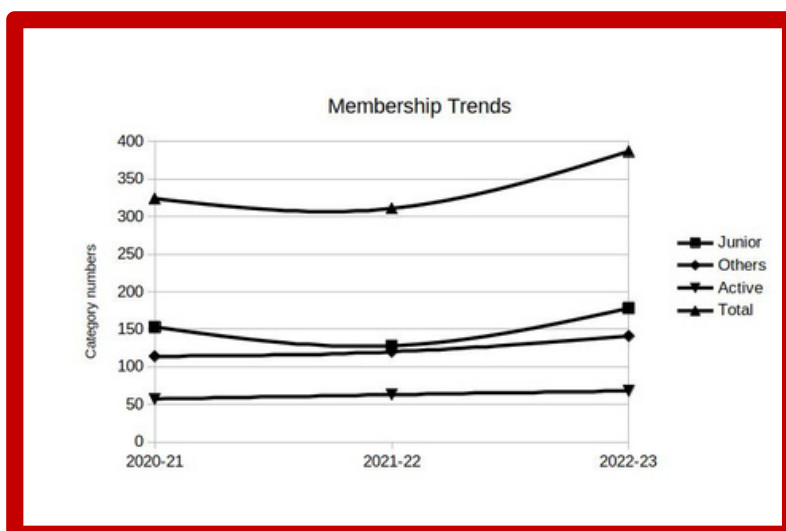
Junior membership increased 40%.

New strategic plan completed.

Future proofed clubhouse via full renovation. The large community facility is now fully accessible, complete with a lift, accessible toilets and pathways/ramps from the carpark and beach, sealed entrance, grassed picnic/stage space, Nipper shed and storage facility. New bar and function space with full bar licence.

Developed new leadership model to streamline decision making and create a sustainable workload for executive. Model due for ratification and adoption into the club's constitution. New constitution being reviewed to reflect a contemporary governance structure.

Acquired 2 new sponsors and maintained all existing sponsors.





Lifesaving and training

- Identified the need for, and successfully delivered, IRB course to bolster patrolling & water safety services.
- Formed patrol working party to reengage past members. 82% success rate, reengaging 22 past patrolling members.
- 356 preventative actions and 22 rescues.
- 300% increase in ART, IBR crew and IRB driver awards.
- Largest club attendance at state Development Camp - 5 participants and 4 management.
- Nipper Leadership Camp for U10-U14.

Surf sports

- Launch of Team CP and inaugural Surf Sports Forum, including the preparation of rescue ready lifesavers through tailor made programs and engagement strategies.
- Implementation of structured coaching plans U14 - Masters.
- Upskilling and accreditations of a new development coach and mentor/assessor.
- Implementation of club equipment usage register and purchase of a new equipment.
- Implementation of the Inaugural AFL Grand Final Ski Race.
- State Masters Point Score Champions - 3rd year in a row – 15 competitors.
- Club depth on display at State Open Championships winning the Lifesaver and Taplin Relays.
- Record number of competitors participating in carnivals, including 34% increase at the Senior State Titles and 5 members in state team.
- Members medalling at the Aussies and Coolangatta Gold.
- Provided carnival officials, including the Carnival Referee, for Statewide carnivals, Championship carnivals, Australian Titles and Endurance Series.
- Key events hosted: Ironman 70.3 Tasmania, Senior State Championships, Ocean Swims, Surf Festival.

Inclusion

- Acknowledgment of Country in consultation with the local indigenous community.
- Collaborations with Disabled Surfers Association, Sisters in Surf All-Female Patrol, Rainbow Beaches Weekend, TasPride Festival.
- Collaboration with other clubs on Southern Region Starfish Nippers Program, nearly 60 participants.
- Purchase of 2 beach wheel chairs and 24/7 community access.
- Collaboration with the Sorell Council on accessible parking, pathways and ramps for beach access.

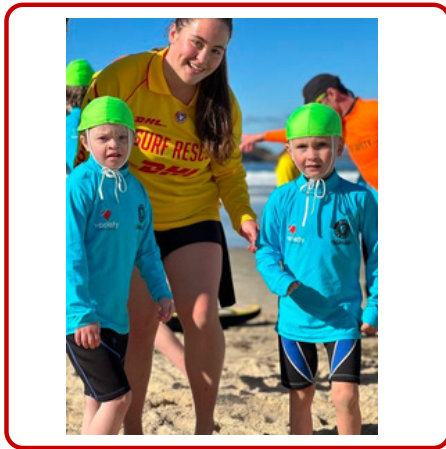

Kane was our Junior Club Captain, competed for our state and won many a state medal. We were honoured to be able to have a ceremonial paddle out for Kane which was attended by around 250 people.

Kane will be forever remembered as Carlton Park's own Superman.

The Surf Sport's Report- Michael (Moz) Moschogianis

The 2022/23 season started in stark contrast to the previous year with our clubhouse in full operation, making training and hosting of events so much more conducive to the development and operations of TeamCP.

TeamCP made some massive gains and inroads into being recognised as the premier Surf Sports Team in the state. Everyone should be congratulated for their efforts and pulling together in order to achieve our goals.

The season started again with the Coolangatta Gold with 3 members, Shayne Jupp, Andrea Wolfert and Michael Moschogianis taking on the iconic race. Record entries again this year for both the Mercury 7HOFM Surf Safari and The Carlton Park Surf Festival. Thank you to all club members who either volunteered their time to put the events together and or turned up in numbers on the start line to support the multiple events. Other multi-discipline events such as the Tasmanian Ocean Swim Series, Winter Series, Tasmanian Marathon Series and the Ironman 70.3, were all very well supported by our community and TeamCP in large, and provided some fantastic fundraising, racing and training opportunities for our members.

Highlights of the 2022/23 Season:

- Launch of TeamCP and inaugural Surf Sport Forum, including the preparation of rescue ready lifesavers through tailor made programs and engagement strategies.
- Implementation of TeamCP merchandise.
- Development of structured coaching plans U14 - Masters.
- Implementation of club equipment usage register and purchase of new single skis and double ski.
- Running of the Inaugural AFL Grand Final Ski Race.
- TeamCP was represented by Lulu Peart, Sam Castle, Ethan Leary, Will Mackinnon and Lachie Mackinnon in Tasmanian State Teams, along with a host of TeamCP members competing in the Manly and Freshwater Carnivals.
- A strong team of 15 competitors took on the Tasmanian Masters State Championships at Ulverstone winning a swag of medals resulting in Team CP winning the Overall Points Score for the 3rd time in a row by over 130 points.
- A record number of competitors participated in carnivals, including a 34% increase at the Senior State Titles on our home beach. Ultimate club strength was on display at the State Championships, winning the Lifesaver and Taplin Relays....along with a haul of medals across all disciplines... a huge congratulations to Sam Castle on winning the Binni Wilson Award for Competitor of the Carnival: U17 Surf race - silver, Ironman and Board race - gold: Open Ironman, Board race and Taplin - gold.

The Aussies returned to the West Coast of Australia with a team of 7 competitors and 1 official making the long trip to Scarborough.

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

(a) General Information
